The 1991 Street of Dreams opens today at the Montreux development on Cougar Mountain in Issaquah.

Eight homes featured in the eighth annual show range in price from \$425,000 to \$695,000.

Here's the skinny on this year's dream street:

■ **Dates:** July 20 to Aug. 25.

■ **Times:** 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. each day.

■ **Tickets:** \$6.50 for adults, \$5.50 for senior citizens and children ages 2 through 17.

■ **Parking:** Visitors will not be allowed to park in the Montreux development. Parking will be available at the gravel lot behind the Safeway store near 12th Avenue N.W. and Gilman Boulevard in Issaquah. There, shuttle buses will transport visitors every 10-15 minutes to the Streets of Dreams.
